

IMPORT OF VEHICLES

ARGENTINEAN CITIZEN FOREIGNER WITH PERMANENT RESIDENCY

DOCUMENTATION

1. Original title of the vehicle, legalized by the Argentine Consulate at origin.
2. Purchase invoice or certificate of value, legalized by the Argentine Consulate at origin.
3. Original passport: upon arriving at Ezeiza airport, the passport must be stamped by Migration with the date of entry. If the passport is not stamped, please download the "Constancia de Ingreso" from <https://www.migraciones.gov.ar/transitos>. Argentineans with multiple citizenship: must enter with Argentine passport.
4. Fully certified and legalized passport copies, including the blank pages (if it has been issued for less than 2 years, a fully certified and legalized copy of the previous passport will also be required).
5. Visa or another document at country of origin.
6. Residence Certificate issued by the Argentine Consulate at country of origin showing that you have lived more than 2 years abroad. It must be legalized by the same Consulate. **Please bear in mind that this certificate has 6 months of validity from its issuance.**
7. Migration Certificate of the last 3 years issued by the Dirección Nacional de Migraciones (Argentina). **After your arrival in Argentina**, you can obtain it through Migration's web page: <http://www.migraciones.gov.ar/certificaciones/index.htm>, or our company can obtain it on your behalf with an additional cost.
8. DNI copy, front and back.
9. CUIL copy.
10. Certificate of address in Argentina issued by the police, Registro Civil or notary.
11. Certified and legalized signature on a form that we provide.

The documentation of the vehicle (points 1 and 2) in foreign language must be translated into Spanish by a public translator in Argentina and legalized by the Colegio de Traductores. We recommend sending the documentation in advance via email to the Translators Association info@traduc.com.ar and request "translation into Spanish with legalization".

Certifications and legalizations (points 4 and 11): by a public notary (in Argentina) and the Colegio de Escribanos, being able to do it at our office from 11:30am to 4:30pm by appointment.

CUSTOMS REGULATIONS

- a. The vehicle must be registered under the name of the owner minimum 3 months before his/her return to Argentina.
- b. It is allowed to import 1 (one) car and 1 (one) motorcycle per person over 18 years old.
- c. Duty/tax-free import will be authorized as long as:
 - The CIF value is lower than US\$ 15.000. CIF = value of the car + cost of the ocean freight + international insurance (the last one represents 1% applied to the sum of the value of the car plus the cost of ocean freight).
 - Has lived abroad for at least 2 years (Certificate of Residence issued by the Argentine Consulate at origin).
- d. If the CIF value is higher than US\$ 15.000 taxes/duties will be applied 85% (gas) or 100% (diesel) on the CIF value.
- e. Motorcycles, trucks and vans: must pay duties/taxes whatever their value.
- f. Some luxury cars are not allowed to be imported. Please check with our company in advance.
- g. The vehicle must arrive up to 6 months after the arrival of the owner in Argentina.
- h. The vehicle cannot arrive at Buenos Aires port prior to the arrival of the owner in Argentina.
- i. If for any reason the owner must travel abroad, the clearance process will be on hold until he/she returns to Argentina.

REMARKS

- a. The presence of the consignee is required during the customs inspection at port.
- b. After the customs release and in order to start the patenting process, the consignee must have a security level 3 tax code (clave fiscal – AFIP), must generate the Clave Única de Identificación Tributaria (CUIT) and have the address updated in the DNI.

Personal Data: All documentation containing personal information will be treated confidentially, not distributed except for the purposes for which it is requested. Exempting legitimate requests from law enforcement authorities.

IMPORT OF VEHICLES

FOREIGNER WITH PRECARIA OR TEMPORARY VISA

DOCUMENTATION

1. Original title of the vehicle or carnet de passage.
2. Original passport: upon arriving at Ezeiza airport, the passport must be stamped by Migration with the date of entry. If the passport is not stamped, please download the "Constancia de Ingreso" from <https://www.migraciones.gov.ar/transitos>.
3. Fully certified and legalized passport copies, including the blank pages (if it has been issued for less than 1 year, a fully certified and legalized copy of the previous passport will also be required).
4. Visa or another document at country of origin (if applicable).
5. Precaria or Temporary visa in Argentina.
6. DNI copy, front and back (Argentine ID card, only if available).
7. CUIL copy (labor ID in Argentina).
8. Migration Certificate of the last 3 years issued by the Dirección Nacional de Migraciones (Argentina). **After your arrival in Argentina**, you can obtain it through Migration's web page: <http://www.migraciones.gov.ar/certificaciones/index.htm>, or our company can obtain it on your behalf with an additional cost.
9. Letter from the employer in Argentina (model to be provided by our company).
10. Certificate of address in Argentina issued by the police, Registro Civil or notary (not required for air shipments).
11. Certified and legalized signature on a form that we provide.

CUSTOMS REGULATIONS

- a. The vehicle must be registered under the name of the owner minimum 3 months before his/her return to Argentina.
- b. It is allowed to import 1 (one) car and 1 (one) motorcycle per person over 18 years old.
- c. The vehicle must arrive with the plate from the country of origin.
- d. The vehicle must arrive up to 6 months after the arrival of the owner in Argentina.
- e. The vehicle cannot arrive at Buenos Aires port prior to the arrival of the owner in Argentina.
- f. If for any reason the owner must travel abroad, the clearance process will be on hold until he/she returns to Argentina.
- g. The vehicle will enter under temporary admission, which has to be renewed every 8 months at the Customs House. This must be done for the time the owner of the vehicle stays in Argentina, renewing his visa and until he/she decides to export it. Please bear in mind that if the temporary admission is not duly renewed on time, duties/taxes plus a customs fine will be applied and the Customs House could order the hijacking of the vehicle.

REMARKS

- The presence of the owner is required during the customs inspection at port.
